Culturally Responsive Teaching Practices

Culturally responsive teaching acknowledges, responds to, and celebrates fundamental cultures and offers full, equitable access to education for students from all cultures.

- Rigor: Communication of high expectations

Professional Learning for Self-Contained Services Teachers will include the following:

- Concept-based curriculum
 - Connect disciplines through established universal themes
 - Embed culturally responsive practices
- Provide collaboration between Middle School Language Arts and Social Studies teachers
 - Maintain and improve the interdisciplinary focus
- Provide Professional Development for IB teachers to focus on collaboration between and within subjects
 - Provide avenues to engage students as inquirers and thinkers
 - Develop knowledge questions across disciplines

Professional Learning for Teachers of Students Receiving Domain-Specific and Differentiated Services will include the following

- Coaching, co-teaching, and collaboration from the Advanced Learning Department

- On average, 20% of students will demonstrate some form of mental health disorder during their school years. *
